A bespoke learning experience

At Esland Doncaster School, we believe every child deserves the opportunity to thrive in life. We are a nurturing and inclusive community where emotional wellbeing, personal growth, and academic achievement are equally valued. Every learner is supported to feel safe, understood, and confident in their potential.

Our ethos is shaped by four core values that guide all relationships and learning experiences: Fun, Bold, Curious, and Kind. These values help us build a school culture grounded in connection, consistency, and compassion, enabling children to develop resilience and self-belief.

We recognise that our students need more than access to knowledge. They need emotional safety, trusting relationships, and personalised pathways that celebrate their strengths while supporting their individual needs. Our curriculum is rooted in therapeutic principles and delivered through small-group learning, hands-on experiences, and tailored opportunities that promote engagement and success.

From the moment each child joins us, we commit to understanding them deeply. We seek to identify barriers early, champion strengths, and create an environment where students feel confident to explore, express themselves, and grow. Working closely with families, carers, and external professionals, we provide a truly holistic, child-centred education.

We know that success looks different for every learner. Through flexible curriculum routes, therapeutic support, and bespoke learning packages, we prepare each young person not only for academic progress but for life beyond school, confident, capable, and ready for their next steps.

Our ethos is simple: We know our students. We nurture their wellbeing. We challenge them to grow and we help them shape a future they can be proud of.



Our school

A sensory friendly, calm and connected place to learn

Based at Melton Park, Esland Doncaster School sits within the peaceful rural landscape of High Melton, surrounded by long established green space and woodland that create a calm, spacious environment where students can feel settled and ready to learn. The layout ensures safe access, clear boundaries and a sense of connection to a broader learning community.

Alongside its natural setting, the park is also home to neighbouring businesses such as a nursery, café and training facilities, helping to create a small, supportive community around the site and offering opportunities for positive, age appropriate interaction.

This blend of tranquillity and gentle community presence makes Esland Doncaster School an inviting and reassuring location for families choosing a nurturing school environment.



Learning spaces

The school is a well equipped, thoughtfully designed environment created to meet the diverse needs of our students. It includes ten high quality learning spaces, featuring a dedicated food technology room and a calm, self referral space. Each area is carefully tailored to support our wide age range and the individual profiles of our learners. Every space is structured to encourage focused learning, emotional regulation, and positive, meaningful engagement.

Outdoor Environment

We are fortunate to have access to a variety of outdoor spaces, including a small woodland area that supports outdoor learning, wellbeing activities and opportunities for exploration. The natural setting provides a calming backdrop and enables us to integrate nature-based approaches into our curriculum.

Our curriculum

At Esland Doncaster School, our curriculum provides a highly personalised, therapeutically informed and stage appropriate learning experience that enables every student to thrive in life: academically, socially and emotionally. Adapted from the national curriculum but rooted in a stage not age philosophy, it ensures that each learner receives the right level of structure, challenge and support to make meaningful progress and prepare confidently for life beyond school. Many of our students have experienced trauma or negative periods in their education, and some may have been out of school for a significant time. That's why we prioritise creating the right curriculum, delivered in the right way, to meet the unique needs of every child. Our approach places strong emphasis on:

- Emotional safety and trusted relationships, ensuring students can access learning successfully.
- Communication, oracy and interaction, supporting students to express themselves, regulate emotions and build relationships.
- Reading, writing and numeracy, building essential academic foundations for long term success.
- Independence and functional life skills, embedded throughout all stages.

This ensures a curriculum that is not only academically ambitious but also deeply attuned to the needs of students with diverse and complex learning profiles. Students follow individual pathways and work towards a range of qualifications and accredited outcomes such as Functional Skills, GCSE's and BTEC's. We understand that many of our students may have had negative experiences of school or may have been out of education for some time, so we place great emphasis on building the right curriculum with the right approach for each child.

Students and families will have access to independent careers advice and guidance to explore opportunities and identify next steps for each young person.

Therapeutic approach

Therapeutically informed approach

We have a therapeutically informed approach to teaching, working to ensure that broader individual needs are met so that learning can take place.

Our staff have extensive knowledge and experience working with young people with additional needs, and they receive ongoing weekly in-house clinical CPD (continuing professional development) to inform their practice further.

Extra targeted training is provided where appropriate for staff in specific roles or to help them meet the needs of individual students. Our clinical team also offers specialist therapeutic support, including:

- Speech and Language Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Counselling
- Art Therapy

The school's behaviour policy is based on the principles of relational behaviour management. We understand that much of the behaviour presented by the students attending our school is needs-driven.

When a student first joins us, their parents or carers will be involved in writing a behaviour support plan that informs staff and enables them to implement individualised approaches for managing challenging behaviour. We supplement this with trauma-informed approaches, such as the PACE (playfulness, acceptance, curiosity, and empathy) therapeutic model.



Admissions criteria

We'll consider referrals for students who:

- Are aged between 7 – 18 years old
- Have an Education, Health and Care plan (EHCP)
- Have a primary need related to:
 - Autistic Spectrum Condition (ASC)
 - Speech, Language and Communication needs (SLCN)
 - Anxiety
 - Emotionally based school avoidance
 - Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs (SEMH) related to any of the above
- Are able (or have the potential) to:
 - Access a broad and balanced curriculum resembling the National Curriculum at key stage 2, 3, 4 and 5
 - Access the teaching primarily as part of a small group (up to five)
- May also present with:
 - Challenging behaviour within mainstream settings (due to needs above not being appropriately met)
 - A history of school refusal and/or placement breakdowns
 - Barriers to learning such as dyslexia and dyspraxia
 - Additional communication and/or sensory needs
 - Academic progress below age related expectations
 - ADHD, OCD, ADD, PDA, Tourette's Syndrome (as a secondary or additional diagnosis to those listed above)

Admissions process

Students are placed at Esland Doncaster School following a referral by their Local Authority (LA). Our panel will review the referral paperwork, and if we feel we can meet the young person's needs, we'll ask for the LA's permission to complete an assessment to determine their suitability for a placement.

Our assessment process involves young people visiting the school with their parents/carers. We'll give them a tour of the school, discuss its provision, and what additional adjustments may be required.

In some circumstances, we may contact previous school placements and other professionals working with the young person to gain additional feedback that will support their referral paperwork.

Once the assessment is complete, and if both parties agree to proceed, we'll approach the LA with a formal placement offer before contacting parents/carers to begin transition arrangements.
